The 62 mile route climbs to 2440 feet. We head from the Sheraton Waikiki along the southeastern shore of Oahu around Diamonda to Kailua and back. Riders will raise a minimum of \$650.00 to help us increase research and education in tree care. The ride includes a tree planting and ceremony at a local elementary school, led by arborist entertainment/advocate group, TreeCircus.
